Buying less or second-hand when you do buy is a great way to reduce waste:


- ✓ Use charity shops and online platforms like <u>freecycle</u>

Art Year 7 & 8




Students will all receive their own personalised feedback in their next careers session.

What is Kik?

Kik is classed as a social network where users can message each other, share photos/videos as well as video chat.

What do I need to be aware of?

- Groups once a user joins a group then your child can receive messages from other members of that group. Some of the groups are centred around topics that are inappropriate for under 18s.
- Adverts
- Location sharing
- Explicit content including images, videos and messages.
- Live streaming/videos risk of seeing/hearing inappropriate content.
- Talking to strangers

NCA issues urgent warning about sextortion

The National Crime Agency has issued an alert due to the rise in global cases.

The NCA state that "all age groups and genders are being targeted, but a large proportion of cases have involved male victims aged between 14-18." [Source:

It is important to talk to your child about this issue due to the rise in cases, so your child is aware of the signs.

Chatting online

A recent report by the BBC focused on how a child was asked for inappropriate images when chatting online. Ofcom also found the following:

- 3 in 5 secondary school children (11-18) have been contacted online in a way that 'potentially made them feel uncomfortable'.
- Approximately 30% of children have received an unwanted friend or follow request.
- Around 1 in 6 secondary students (16%) have either been sent nude or semi-nude photos or been asked to share these themselves.

In addition to social media apps that include a chat facility, most online games also allow communication, for example FIFA and Fortnite. Depending on the game, this may be via the ingame text chat, direct messages or talking through headphones. Some games do offer the ability to switch communication off or restrict bad language so make sure settings appropriate to your child are set up for each of the games they play.

How can I mitigate the risks?

- Ensure your child is accessing age-appropriate apps/games and that appropriate parental controls are set up.
- Chat to your child about the risks above so they are aware of what can happen online.
- Depending on the age of your child, it may be more appropriate for devices to be used in family rooms so you can monitor what they are doing and if they are chatting to others.

Reporting other users

It can be difficult to moderate online chat so ensure your child knows how to block and report others who make them feel uncomfortable and that they know to talk to you or a trusted adult if they have any concerns.

adding more events in the future!








Religious Education




Extra-Curricular Clubs
