### **Eco-Committee Update**



#### **ECO SCHOOLS accreditation**

Pupils at Avonbourne Academies have been awarded the coveted Eco-Schools Green Flag for a second year in a row – with distinction!

The Eco-Schools Green Flag is an international accreditation that recognises efforts to raise environmental awareness amongst young people, whilst taking action to make their school more sustainable. Avonbourne has now retained its status as an accredited Eco-School, following our achievement last year.

Since Avonbourne began working towards an Eco-Schools Green Flag during 2021, achievements have included planting 60 hedges, 15 saplings and introducing a recycling scheme across the site.

And this year, pupils at Avonbourne Academies have built on these strong foundations, collaborating with Mrs Donnelly to work on three Eco-Schools topics: school grounds, waste and biodiversity. They planned a variety of projects including litter picks throughout the year on school grounds and in our surrounding community areas; the implementation of a recycled car tyre garden that was recently completed; the continued upkeep of school-wide classroom recycling with a community feeling during student-led Wednesday morning recycling bin emptying; pen recycling in nearly every classroom – that's almost 90; charity partnership to track our school's avian biodiversity; and planting copious local flora seeds throughout the Spring and Summer.

Assistant Principal, Mrs Tsabet, said, 'We are incredibly proud to be awarded Distinction two years in a row. The school's Eco Committee is made up of a wonderfully committed group of students, and their efforts this year to make the school more sustainable exemplify many of our school's REACH values'.

## Religious Education





This term, the RE department took students from Year 7 and United Sixth Form on a school trip to Winchester Cathedral. The students loved walking through the bustling market before taking part in a series of activities, such as making clay gargoyles, with some students getting experimental and modelling them on Mr Kidman! During a tour of the cathedral, the students followed the stories revealed by the stained-glass windows before visiting the crypt, tombs, and the grave of Jane Austen. After lunch, and a trip to the gift shop, our students completed a Question-and-Answer session with Canon Roly, a Christian with Jewish ancestry. We learnt how he tried to accept both faiths in his life and the crisis of faith and discrimination he faced as a result of doing so.

Throughout the year, the RE department have continued to welcome the local Christian charity, 'The Pace Trust', into our Wednesday Lunchtime club, 'Big Questions.' This term, students have been discussing topical issues such as 'How can I deal with stress and anxiety?', 'What is time', 'Why do some people lose their faith?', and 'How do I know that God is real?' We have also begun the Youth Alpha Project, where we have discussed topics such as 'Who is Jesus', 'Why did Jesus die' and 'Is there more to life than this?'

The RE department have also continued the extremely popular Tea Club during Tuesday lunchtimes where students get to sample and learn about a variety of unusual tea flavours from around the world. Finally, this past term has seen the successful launching of the new United Learning Religious Education curriculum into Year 9, with the introduction of the 'Life and death', 'Equality' and 'Buddhism' modules.



Careers at Avonbourne has been extremely busy in this last part of the summer term. We had an exciting trip to the Arts University in Bournemouth with some of our year 8 students. They experienced a tour of the campus and got to look at some of their facilities and exhibitions. This was followed by a Q and A session with student ambassadors from all three of our local universities; Arts University Bournemouth, Bournemouth University and AECC. Students found out what university life was like and how they made the decision on what they wanted to study.





We also had our year 9 mock interview week. We welcomed individuals from local businesses to host this for us and students were interviewed in groups for a job, covering sections that included skills for the job and research about the organisation. Well done to all the students involved who worked extremely hard to prepare themselves for the interview and presented themselves in an excellent manner. The employers were blown away by the year 9's level of professionalism and maturity. These skills should help to prepare themselves for their post 16 interviews. 


# Arts and Wellbeing workshops - in partnership with MBN Arts

This term we received funding to support our Y9 students with a creative intervention to support their transition into KS4. 30 students were chosen to take part in 3 half-day workshops in graffiti art and music production at MBN Arts based in Townsend.

Below is an account from Josh B who took part in the workshops:

I really enjoyed the creative arts trips as they showed me various variations of arts that I would not of probably of enjoyed if I did not try them. The workshops have helped me appreciate arts more. I am now glad that I have chosen an art subject as GCSE. If this were offered again, I would take part. I now feel more able to be creative when it comes to arts that I would not have tried unless offered. I enjoyed the spray painting lessons the most as they taught me that graffiti is not always used as a terrible thing and can be used to spread messages and art. Even though these workshops were in the last term of the school year, they were definitely a major highlight of the year.





This final term of the academic year 2022-2023 has seen the final STEM trip for the year 9 boys going to the AECC Chiropractor's College for the day. During the day, the boys were able to take part in several different activities which show career paths they could go down in many different directions and allow them to see how the science they learn in the classroom is applicable to everyday life. Some of the workshops on offer included maths problem solving, biomechanics of sport and even an opportunity to discover how x-ray machines worked; some of the students were even able to use the machines themselves!





Turning back towards the classroom, year 7 have been excitedly learning about ecology, including how feeding relationships work and how different organisms depend on each other for lots of different things such as resources, pollination and shelter! We then focussed in on how we can find out the populations of organisms in an area, and the year 7 students thoroughly enjoyed using quadrats to count the numbers of different plants which grow on our school field. It was a great opportunity to get out into the sunshine and do some science in the field! For students who are interested in this area, there are several events in the local community where this can be explored further. For example, 29th July marks the Youth Volunteering event at Upton Country Park where young people can get involved with conservation work and get to know likeminded people at the same time!

Finally, our students have been working hard on their homework this term! The leader boards show that we need to give a huge recognition to the following students for smashing their homework this term and giving themselves a boost in school and completing the most sessions in their science homework: Maria S (year 7), Emili K (year 8), Ruby F (year 9) and Seema A (year 10).

We are very excited for them to carry on their roles and continuing to be fantastic role models in our student community.


# FRIENDS OF AVONBOURNE ACADEMIES (FOAA)

During the summer rotation the four sports the boys have taken part in were; Tennis and Softball, following our Fit to Perform curriculum, Cricket, Fit to Lead and Athletics, Fit for Life. The students completed six lessons on each.

Additionally, students had the opportunity to try a variety of clubs, compete in the local area for a range of sports against other schools and take part in sporting workshops at other venues. 


